“Marshall” Filmmakers Are Spending \$70,000 To Prepare The Central Terminal Train Station For Filming.

“Filmmakers are spending \$70,000 on the terminal to prepare it for the shooting of scenes here in the next two to three weeks.”

“Marshall” Production Company “Spent A Lot Of Money Making Improvements To War Memorial Stadium, Which Produced A Benefit For The City Because It Extended The Life Of The Stadium Until It Was Ultimately Demolished In 1988.”

“Much has been made of the economic impact the filming of the motion picture “Marshall” will make in Buffalo in the next six weeks. However, until now, little has been said about the more lasting effect the production will have on a well-known city landmark In 1983 when The Natural was filmed in Buffalo, the movie company spent a lot of money making improvements to War Memorial Stadium, which produced a benefit for the city because it extended the life of the stadium until it was ultimately demolished in 1988.”

“Crews Are Restoring Kiosks And Ticket Booths, And Making Other Cosmetic Fix Ups The Type Of Which Those Who Have Stewardship Of The [The Terminal], Could Only Dream Of Doing With Several Years Of Fundraising.”

“Filmmakers are not doing a top to bottom renovation of the terminal...just the parts they’ll need to shoot their scenes, according to Hoover, who says the cleaning of the vaulted ceilings and replacement of missing panes of glass in the windows can actually be done digitally by computers during the film’s post production period. However, crews are restoring kiosks and ticket booths, and making other cosmetic fix ups the type of which those who have stewardship of the landmark, could only dream of doing with several years of fundraising.”
